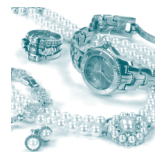

Keeping your jewellery safe



- Jewellery should be stored securely in a suitable safe. Various grades of safe are available according to the value, size and number of items you want to store in it.
- Before purchasing a safe, it is advised that the owner consults with their insurer as they may require a certain grading to cover the contents in case of loss.
- Safes should be supplied and fitted by a company approved by the Master Locksmiths Association. The safe should be Sold Secure tested and approved - you can check the details on **www.soldsecure.com**
- The safe should be fixed to a solid wall or floor with the fixings inside the safe.
- Take photographs of your valuables and write a short description of each of them. Register your valuables on **www.immobilise.com**
- Don't keep large amounts of cash in your home. Store it at a bank, building society or post office.
- Ensure all windows and doors are locked when you're not at home.
- Always use your security alarm.
- Consider installing CCTV cameras.
- Be aware of advertising the fact that your house is empty – for example, by posting messages on social media regarding dates and times of family weddings.
