You have been interviewed voluntarily under caution for an offence. This leaflet explains what happens next.

What happens next?

The Officer in charge (OIC) of your case will keep you updated on the progress of the investigation. We may need to speak to you again so please update the OIC if your address or telephone number changes. The contact details for the OIC are on the back of this leaflet.

Once the investigation is complete, there are three possible outcomes:

- No further action at this time. However, it is possible that the case may be reopened if new evidence comes to light or if a victim requests a review of the decision.
- Out of Court Disposal, such as a Community Resolution, Caution or Conditional Caution
- Prosecution, where you will be instructed to attend Court.

What happens next?

Attending court

If you receive a letter telling you to attend court, you must go to court on the date and time given in your letter

- If you do not go, the court may issue a warrant for your arrest or they may hear the case in your absence.
- If a warrant is issued for your arrest, you will be arrested. You may be held in custody before you are brought before the court.
- You will be entitled to legal representation and may be eligible for legal aid.
